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VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE BOT:

Following thorough discussion at our past 3 meetings, the Board has identified our car park as a <u>significant risk</u>. We have monitored the car park over the past month and have noticed a couple of 'near misses' that would have had a catastrophic outcome. This involved school students in the car park moving around the cars in a way that put them in danger.

The Board would like to reiterate that your children are your responsibility once they leave the school ramp into the car park. It is CRUCIAL that they be supervised at all times.

The teachers have reinforced the messages we teach about safety around vehicles and we would strongly encourage you to continue sharing these messages with your children at home.

If you are going to have a conversation with other parents (planned or spontaneous) we politely request that this happens in the school courtyard, not in the car park. Therefore, your children should be safe playing in school grounds while they wait (or in after school care if need be).

Finally, we need to remind the students that there is no riding bikes, skateboards or scooters in the car park. This makes it very scary for the drivers who may not see a child shoot out on their wheeled transport, resulting in an extremely serious incident.

If we can all take responsibility for ensuring the safety of our children in the car park, we may very well prevent a serious accident and save the life of a young one. Please support our Board of Trustees in this effort to ensure the safety of our students around the entrance of our school.
