Innovative Learning

This year every class at Bayview is an innovative learning class. Some classes have 2-3 teachers and some have one. Please be assured that the teacher to child ratio is the same regardless of how many teachers there are. We no longer have e-learning classes but we have voluntary Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) from Y3 upwards. Please know that this is voluntary and not a requirement of any class at Bayview. Every habitat has 4 school devices that can be used by students throughout the day as required. Should you have an issue please communicate with the appropriate person. If it is regarding your child, your first stop should be the class teacher. Next stop is the Learning Group Leader: Harakeke - Shelley Matuku; Kauanuanu - Alyssa Farrow; and Pikorua - Danielle Grace. Any health and safety type issues can be brought to the attention of either Andy or myself. We both have an open door policy and often are able to see you when you call in to the office. On the odd occasion, we may need to book another time with you so we apologise for this in advance.

Communication

We use a variety of methods to try to communicate with parents about school activities and events. A newsletter comes home every second Thursday with general news and a diary of upcoming events. Separate notices come home about specific events and trips so please check your child's bookbag/schoolbag regularly for these. We also use our Bayview Primary facebook page and the Friends of Bayview facebook page to inform and celebrate events. Our school website is where you can find most information about how the school functions and you can notify us of an absence, pre-enrol a child, and sign up to receive our regular newsletter. We have our Kindo website for paying for stationery, hats, trips and sports teams this year and you can order your child's lunch on Kindo as well. We also communicate events on our electronic sign.

We do try our best to let parents know what is happening and try to give lots of notice especially when money is required. Please help us help you by signing up to the electronic forms of communication and be proactive in checking your child's bag for any "old skool' notices! **Uniform Blues**

Please note that it is important that your child wears the correct school uniform. You may be aware that last year we had an issue with the polo shirt and had to allow students to wear a plain light blue polo.
