The Kiwi competitions are written by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students and are based on the New Zealand curriculum. The online competitions will be run in the last 2 weeks of Term 2. All participating students will be awarded a certificate and prizes will be awarded to top students in each year group. The cost for a student to participate is \$8.50 per competition entered.

Accounts

If you would like your child to ride a bike to school without parental supervision you should advise the office in writing. It is the parent's' responsibility to ensure that their child is aware of the safety requirements of using the road and footpaths. It is important that the correct safety gear is worn. For those children who cycle to school on a regular basis, a yellow vest is available at the school office, free of charge. All bikes, scooters etc. must be walked inside school grounds between 8.30am and 3.30pm. Bikes and scooters are brought to school at the owner's risk and must be stored in the racks provided.
