How can you help your child? Be positive about their learning; set high but realistic expectations and gently encourage them to succeed; ensure they are emotionally and physically healthy and ready to learn at school.

Encourage them to be curious about the world around them; help them build friendships with others; and teach them to follow safety rules.

Be involved and participate in the wide variety of activities that we invite you to join us for.


Walking School Bus Promo
