Wow week 4 already! We have had a very busy start to the year. We have enrolled 39 new students and our roll is currently sitting on 366 students. It is highly likely our roll will go over 400 by the end of this year! We have been hassling the MoE for more space but the MoE is not so forthcoming with this. We will continue to hassle them with our roll growth numbers until we can get some kind of response from them. Sadly it all comes down to money.

You will have noticed the roofing works that have been completed over the summer break. There has been a slight delay in starting phase 2 with the roofing iron not being ready. This should be delivered on Saturday so that works can be started next week. As you are aware this whole project involves painters, builders, gas connection technicians, as well as the roofing company and we very much appreciate your patience and understanding around the disruption around the school.

### **Friends of Bayview School (FOBS)**

Thank you to all the parents who attended our FOBS meeting last Friday and to those who made contact via Facebook to add their suggestions. We have organised a range of fundraising events for the year and will space these out so we do not ask for lots of money all at once. Our initial fundraising (term 1) is to help offset the cost of taking parent helpers to camp. This is a full on 24/7 job which ensures the safety of our students. We know when it comes time for your child to attend camp you will want the same level of care and thus will support these fundraisers. The other thing we would like to raise funds for are wet weather games for classes. We have equipment in classes but it would be great to have some other games (packs of cards, etc) for kids to play with during these times. Other ideas we have talked about include: a raffle, discos, an a-thin, colour run, and quiz night. We will need helpers for each event so please follow our Bayview Primary Facebook page and watch out for notices and requests for help ☺

The remaining fundraising will be towards building a new big adventure playground. The big green one is very old and we are having to replace pieces of equipment on it on a regular basis. Our aim is to get our students to design a new one with equipment they want to use. To do this they will need to investigate existing playgrounds in the Auckland area. Obviously this is a big project and we will need to apply for some grants to supplement the fundraising we do.
