

Principal's Piece

Dear Parents, Nga mihi nui ki a koutou,

Yesterday our full school attended a beautiful mass to celebrate Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday is one of the most important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. The theme for Caritas Lent 2017 comes from Psalm 27: 'Your face, Lord, do I seek'. This phrase reminds us that when we encounter our brothers and sisters, wherever they may live, we encounter the face of Christ. This supports the message we give to all our students about being the "eyes, hands and feet of Christ to others". Drawing on the Caritas Resource our teachers will be working with the students on how they can strengthen their relationship with God through, prayer, their actions and giving to others. Thank you to Ms Fiona Buchanan for her work organising the mass.

Community of Learning.

Great news! After almost two years of planning and preparing, the Minister of Education finally endorsed our Community of Learning application in late December. Here is a brief outline of what the North Shore Catholic Schools Community of Learning is all about. The Community of Learning (CoL) consists of six schools: four Catholic primary schools: St Joseph's, St Leo's, St Mary's and Stella Maris. All of the primary schools provide a

direct pathway to Rosmini College and Carmel College, both of which are Year 7-13 schools.

Mission Statement

The North Shore Catholic Schools Community of Learners will work and learn collaboratively so that all our learners successfully navigate their own learning pathway. We will do this by developing a future focused approach to learning and teaching and providing cohesive and effective transitions between our primary and secondary schools.



Vision

We want our learners to be confident and connected, Catholic learners for life, committed to being the best they can be, acting generously and inclusively, prepared to challenge and shape the future.

With this CoL endorsement, we get additional funding in terms of time allowances for appointed staff to work in and across these schools and these teachers also get additional salary allowances for taking on these roles. We also have access to outside experts to assist us in making our vision a reality.

Progress so far:

• We have appointed three out of four of our Across School teachers. Catherine Mackisack from Carmel and Erin Smyth and Jennifer Herbst from Rosmini College.

• We have engaged Camilla Highfield from Auckland University to provide professional learning and guidance in getting our planning and implementation in place.

• This group are working on creating an online site to keep this community up to date with what is happening.

• Several schools have also appointed their "In school teachers." St Leo's has appointed our allocated 1: Adrienne Williams. We hope to keep you updated termly to let you know how everything is progressing.

We have scheduled a Family School Mass for <u>Sunday 26 March at 9.00am</u>. This is a wonderful opportunity for us to celebrate with the parish as a community and for those who haven't met Father Larry yet, to be able to do so. We will also be presenting our new students and leaders to the community. As with previous years, it is expected that all students will attend in full school uniform. Please let me know if you are not able to attend.
