Dear School Friends and Families



Last Saturday Miss Madden presented at the Southland Numeracy Symposium, to a room full of teachers and principals, and by all accounts, did an excellent job. This 'beyond the call' work prompted me to reflect on the dedication, skills and attributes of the people I work with. This does not just include the staff, but also parents, the board, and community members who all want the best for the children.

On a typical day, I might see teachers supporting another teacher with a challenge they're facing, or discussing ways to help a child because what's happening just isn't working; A support staff member with a 'do anything to help' approach when teachers are in a pressure situation; people coming into school to help children with gardening or reading or swimming; an email from a board member quietly going about a 'between-meeting' task; parents coaching sport after school; teachers talking about learning break-throughs with genuine excitement - Just a few examples of the collaborative culture which characterises our place.

In the same vein, we're fortunate to have the local emergency services -Fire, Police, St John Ambulance, helping us out with our Emergency Preparedness Day next Tuesday. In the morning we're doing a mock lock down exercise. Constable Dave Leach has also arranged Police Dog Handlers to visit and do a demonstration. In the afternoon, there will



be an earthquake drill, followed by post-event exercises - Search and Rescue, First Aid, Evacuee Welfare. We're also being supported by Constable Marty Lohrey (Police Education). So don't be "alarmed' if you hear a lot of noise coming from the school that afternoon (see what I did there? ©).

Next Wednesday, aside from it being her birthday, Miss Mackay is off to visit Tapanui School which runs an excellent play-based learning programme with their Juniors.

At the time of writing this, I'm about to head off to Te Anau to meet up with my Principals' Support Group. We're quite an eclectic bunch, coming from schools ranging from 25 to 425 children, but it's always very valuable learning from each other's experiences, and bringing new ideas back to school (I also hope to bring a fish back this time too, if I can find one in the Waiau on Friday evening!).



I would like to acknowledge the great work Deb Cowie has done in her fixed term roles as Deputy Principal Release Teacher and Beginning Teacher release teacher. Deb is finishing these roles at the end of this term, and we will miss the regularity of her time at school with her bright

presence and excellent inputs, but are pleased that she will still be available for casual relieving. Meanwhile we welcome back Tracey Watson who has been appointed to a 0.3 fixed term teaching role to cover D.P. Release and Acting Principal Release. This will involve 3 days a fortnight in Room 5 to release Mrs Hailes.

Here's a good quote I read recently: "Good opportunities are often disguised as hard labour. That's why so few people recognise them". Have a good weekend (but without too much hard labour I hope ©).

### **Football**


LAST OPPORTUNITY for 8 & 9 year old girls and boys to register for football this season. Phone Cindy on 027 602 7432.

### Police Vetting Volunteers

### Dear Parents

The Vulnerable Children's Act now imposes new responsibilities to the Board of Trustees with ensuring the safety of our children at school. To ensure we are complying with the requirements of the Vulnerable Children Act and to ensure the safety of our children the Board is <u>requesting permission</u> to Police Vet any person working or volunteering at Lumsden School or with Lumsden School children in any capacity e.g. parent helper, coach, overnight camps, day outings, clubs, driving children to events or any other activity where those volunteers are likely to have (or could have) unsupervised contact with students.

We <u>request</u> that any parent/caregiver/volunteer who may wish to help as parent helper, coach, on overnight camps, day outings, clubs, driving children to events or any other activity as part of Lumsden School's programs completes and returns page 2, signs the applicant authorization on page 3 of the attached document then returns these to school. Also please provide 2 forms of ID e.g passport, birth certificate, firearms licence, driver's licence; one of these must be photographic. The ID can be shown to Sharon or I. This will allow us to be prepared before specific events. These are valid for 3 years. We will keep a record of all parents/caregivers/volunteers who have been police checked and this will be updated as required.

Police Vetting is a responsibility of the Board of Trustees and is undertaken through the New Zealand Police Licensing and Vetting Service Centre.

All information received will be confidential to the Lumsden School Board of Trustees.

Only the requestor – the Principal – will open the returned information.

Please read the attached application carefully, complete page 2 then sign and date the "consent to disclosure" on page 3, then return this to the school office with the documents required.

Please note these steps are being taken as advised as being good practice as per the Vulnerable Children's Act 2014 with the safety of our children as the main priority.

# Section 3: Applicant to complete and return to Approved Agency

  - Any interaction I have had with New Zealand Police, including family violence incidents, and investigations that did not result in prosecution
  - Information subject to name suppression where that information is necessary to the purpose of the vet.
- If I am eligible under the Criminal Records (Clean Slate) Act 2004, my conviction history will not be released unless:
  - a. Section 19(3) of the Clean Slate Act applies to this request (exceptions to the clean slate regime)
  - Section 31(3) of the Vulnerable Children Act 2014 applies to this request (safety checks of core children's workers).

Please see the guide for more information regarding the Clean Slate legislation.

- The Police Vetting Service may disclose new relevant information to the Approved Agency after the completion of the Police Vet in the following circumstances:
  - The vetting request was submitted as part of a children's worker safety check under the Vulnerable Children
    Act 2014; and
  - The Police vet was completed within the past three years; and
  - The release of new information is considered justified under the Privacy Act 1993

The Vetting Service will endeavour to notify you prior to the disclosure.

- Information provided in this consent form may be used to update New Zealand Police records.
- I am entitled to a copy of the vetting result released to the Approved Agency (to be provided by the agency) and can seek a correction by contacting the Vetting Service.
- The Approved Agency will securely dispose of this consent form, copies of identification documents and the vetting result within 12 months of receiving the result unless a longer retention period is required by legislation.
- I may withdraw this consent, prior to Police's disclosure of the vetting result, by notifying the Approved Agency.
