VISION AND HEARING SCREENING

Regional Public Health Wairarapa free vision and hearing screening will take place at school on Wednesday 5 April.

They will be screening:

- Distance Vision for Year 7 students and those Year 8 students who have not completed screening at Year 7
- Colour Vision for Year 7 boys, to identify colour vision defects
- Hearing and Distance Vision for 5 and 6 year old children who missed or did not complete their B4 School Checks
- Children who have transferred schools, who have not yet completed routine vision and hearing screening

Result slips will be sent home with your child if screened by this service

This screening is not a full assessment - near vision used for reading books or hand writing is unable to be screened by this service

If you have concerns in regards to yours child's vision please arrange an appointment with an Optometrist.

You will be notified by mail if further assessment is recommended for your child. Children who wear glasses and/or are under professional care for vision or hearing and have regular checks will not require screening by our service.

Please notify your school if you DO NOT agree to your child being screened.
