ORGANISATION FOR TERM 2

With Mr Brown leaving us the Board of Trustees will start the process of appointing a new deputy principal during term 2. BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

I think our roof looks great! I love the colour as it has just lifted the whole look of the school. Infratel, the firm carrying out the work, have almost completed everything so our classes can stay dry inside and out during the winter!

Infratel has also won the tender to fix our drainage system. Most of this work will be carried out over the April break. This will involve digging up some of the old drains and replacing them so there will be a lot of mud around. We suggest that if your children come and use the school grounds over the break that there should be an adult with them for safety reasons.

Please also keep an eye out over the break for any silly behaviour i.e. kids climbing on the roof. We have already had kids climb on the new roof and this is both extremely dangerous for them but also damages the roof. If you see this kind of behaviour just call the police! You might actually save these kids from a terrible accident.
