Kia ora, and a very warm welcome back to all our returning and new students and their families for the start of the 2017 school year. I hope all managed to have at least a small holiday over the break and have been able to enjoy the rare glimpses of summer. The students have come back to school in very good spirits and the feeling in the school is very positive. It is also great to see the majority of the students wearing their uniform with pride at the start of the year. However this is never plain sailing and few have needed reminders, with the main area of contention often relating to jewellery. This should be inconspicuous and minimal. No bars, spacers or ear stretchers will be acceptable and students and parents should consider the uniform prior to considering any additional piercings. Also, any bracelets, anklets or additional necklaces are not part of the school uniform and students can expect to be asked to remove these.

As we begin 2017, the staff and school will be having a big focus on 'building the momentum'. The key across school focuses will be around Positive Behaviour for Learning, E-Learning, Solo Taxonomy (a common language for learning), and writing as an enabler for academic success. These focuses will be built into our strategic and annual plan and drive much of what we do in the school over the next few years. We will also be working hard to improve communication between school and home, and to do this we need to work to find a consistent means of communication. Our initial push is to ensure we have accurate email addresses for all guardians of students in the school. These email addresses enable access to our parent portal, which contains attendance and account information. They will also become one of our preferred means of getting reports and NCEA information out to parents. An email was sent out to all student guardian email addresses yesterday; if you did not receive one, please contact the school to update this information. We are also in the process of rebuilding our school website and hope to launch this prior to the end of term 1. We hope to make this more interactive and better link in with student learning and school-wide information.

We commence the school year with a slight roll increase, certainly up on previous years, with the largest growth being felt in the secondary part of the school. Year 9 this year has hit 30 students and is by far our biggest year level. We welcomed all our new students and their families into our

school with a very spirited powhiri (below) on Wednesday morning. This included welcoming our new staff members; Chris Toki who will be teaching in Waiporoporo class, Stuart McNaughton who takes over senior Mathematics and Tamati Taukamo who has come on board to provide music tutoring; primarily in guitar, bass and drums. Please be advised that these are provided at a cost.

We had a large shipment of long overdue new furniture arrive for the senior end of the school yesterday and we hope to get this distributed over the next week. It's also great news that the pool has had new covers installed this week. These are also long overdue and will hopefully last for the next 10 years. We ask that all members of the community treat these with care and are not to attempt to remove them.

We will finish this week with Tabloid Sports on Friday afternoon. This will begin with House-based activities from 12.30pm. Notices have gone home with students and these include information about House colours for our new enrolments. Students are still required to arrive and leave school in school uniform. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to get hold of the school office.

2017 Year 8 School Based HPV Vaccination Programme

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is a common viral infection which can cause several cancers affecting both men and women later in life. Early HPV immunisation offers the best protection against contracting this virus.

Starting 2017, **both girls and boys** in Year 8 will be offered free HPV Vaccination through the school based programme. A new updated version

of the vaccine (Gardasil 9) will cover more strains of the virus, providing cover with 2 doses rather than 3 with Gardasil 4.

The vaccination will continue to be available within the GP Practices, however, we encourage you to participate in the school based programme. Girls and boys who have partially started the process with their GP will have the option to complete the course through the school based programme.

To enable students to receive the vaccination at school, parents will need to complete the consent form which will be sent home with the student along with supporting information during the first weeks of term one. Please check with your child or the school to ensure you receive the consent form and information pack.
