It was great to see a strong support crew on the side of the pool during the day, and also a big thank you to those who jumped on the end of stopwatches and assisted during the day. It is very much appreciated. A team of our stronger and abler competitors will be off to the Hurunui Primary Swimming sports next Tuesday and we know they will represent the school strongly at the event, and we wish them the best of luck. With the warmer weather finally upon us and an increase in the use of the pool by the public, the Swim Club has included a reminder in this week's newsletter about expectations when the community uses the pool facilities. It is important that all users use the facilities responsibly and ensure that covers and other equipment are not damaged.

The school e-Learning team met last week to discuss the future direction of computers and technology in the school. Two key areas are coming through as priorities for the school in the immediate future. BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) is a clear area that we want to develop momentum in. We have an expectation that Year 11-13 students should be bringing a device to school if they are able to. This device should not be a cell phone, although there are some limited benefits from having these in the classroom. Cell phones tend to be more of a hindrance than a help and the benefits of a self-managed, wireless ready, keyboard capable device are clear. Year 11-13 students tend to work on individualised programmes, are required to manage their learning during study periods and need to be able to access resources when away from the school. We are not in a position to provide one to one devices but will support those who are not in a position to supply their own. It appears that a large majority of students are able to bring

their own devices; they're just not bringing them. We have worked to alleviate concerns around security and will work with students over the next few weeks to make them more aware of taking care around other student's equipment. The other key area is the school's digital presence, and we can look forward to a new website being launched in the not too distant future. Nga mihi,

#### HAWARDEN SWIMMING POOL

We are lucky to have a pool available for general use, thanks to the cooperation of Hurunui College and the Hawarden Swimming Club. We need all pool users to follow the health and safety rules, and respect the pool facility if we want to keep it open as it is currently. The alternative could be limited opening hours, with paid supervision and subsequently higher prices. After a serious injury at the pool at the weekend it is timely to remind everyone of some of the key rules.

- Do not interfere with pool equipment. This includes the pool covers, seats and metal plates and covers in and around the pool.
- Children under 15 must be supervised by someone aged 15 or older. This means a supervisor inside the pool area keeping an eye on their 'subjects'. Going out for a smoke or drink, or sitting in a vehicle is not supervision Dropping children off at the pool gate and leaving them 'because there are adults in the pool', is not supervision. If you make arrangements for someone else over 15 to supervise, and you know where your children will go when that supervisor leaves, and everyone agrees; that is acceptable.
- Children under 8 years must be supervised by a legal guardian.
- Supervising young children in the small pool means being at the pool side watching them.
- The pool gate must be latched closed when not in use. This is a standard national pool safety rule.

All users pay to keep the pool operating. If you do not have a prepaid key, \$NZ 2 per swimmer is the current fee. We operate on an honesty system. If you have paid once, you can return as many times as you like in the same day. You need someone at the pool to let you in – do not climb the fences. Some people have some creative interpretations of what constitutes \$2!!

> If you witness anyone behaving inappropriately - do something. If you do not want to act, contact someone listed on the pool noticeboard, or if it is serious, contact the Police.

If you see anything that needs fixing or to be attended to, please contact Paul, Melissa or Russell (see noticeboard).

## Total Fire Ban

## Hurunui District Prohibited Fire Season

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Section 22(2) of the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, a PROHIBITED FIRE SEASON is extended over the whole of the Hurunui District Rural Fire Authority fire jurisdiction area as from 8am, Friday 17 February 2016, until further notice.

During the Prohibited Fire Season, it is an offence to light any fires in the open air without a 'Special Fire Permit' issued by the Hurunui District Council Principal Rural Fire Officer.A special fire permit will only be issued to manage a hazard to life or health or other such serious emergency event.

This prohibition includes the use of all barbecues which use or contain solid fuels. As braziers or other similar devices use solid fuel and constitute a fire in the open air, their use is also prohibited. Gas fuelled barbecues and gas cookers, which contain no charcoal or solid fuel are exempt from this notice, provided a high-pressure water supply is available.

## **SPORT NZ Rural Travel Fund 2017**

Funding is now available from the Hurunui District Council's Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund.

The Rural Travel Fund is provided by Sport New Zealand to territorial authorities for distribution in 2017, for the purposes of assisting rural sports clubs and rural school teams with young people aged between 5-19 years, who require subsidies for travel expenses to local sporting competitions.

School teams and sports club teams can apply for this funding provided the applications meet the following criteria:

- A school/club team participating in local sport competition on weekends, that excludes inter school and intra school competitions played during school time.
- A sports/club team participating in organised sport competition through club membership outside of school time.
- Applications are open to Sports clubs and rural school teams from within the Hurunui District.
