The word resiliency often comes up when discussions are had around youth mental health. Resiliency is often perceived as being forever stoic and unwavering in the face of adversity, but it can take on a less hard-line meaning and if we can accept that resilient people can also have bad days and weeks the word retain greater relevance. What resiliency can mean is having the ability to see your way through the hardship and understand that there will be good days ahead. But why do our young people appear less resilient now than what they use to be? It's not that our youth are presenting different problems; there are just more of them presenting with them. More severe depression, anxiety, self-harm, suicide risk, post-traumatic stress, autism spectrum disorders and the list continues. Self-referring and reporting are probably higher, but this cannot account for the average 30%, and in some areas the 100%, increase in referrals to mental health services over the last five years. This increase is also disproportionate to the widening socio-economic inequalities such as child poverty and youth unemployment.

Mental health referrals are also not confined to the poor and disadvantaged. Increases are being seen across all socioeconomic groups. Social media can easily be seen as the culprit to our increasing youth mental health statistics. Social media is likely to be a significant contributing factor in some cases, however more resilient students are able to navigate the tribulations of social media and are able to make it a positive part of their life. For those who are not, they can really struggle. The 24/7 of social media can suffocate the space for some youth to just be with their own feelings and allow them to deal with their own emotions. There is an over saturation of what is happening in other people's lives that makes it more difficult for some youth to deal with what is going on in their own. Children don't have the same opportunity to tune out and switch off that we had as little as only 10-15 years ago. Add in social media bullying, sexting, FOMO (fear of missing out) and you have a potentially very damaging environment. The big question is how we are not developing the same resiliency that seemed to naturally develop in the past? Cotton wool and helicopter Miss Brinsford and students -

parenting can take some of the flak, but this is not the case for all struggling youth. Rising socio inequalities, increased social pressure,

natural disasters and our growing blame culture are also potential big contributors. There is certainly no easy fix and sadly things will probably get worse before they get better.

The NZ Herald is currently conducting an investigation into the resourcing of mental health provisioning in our schools. Although I do applaud their motives, what we do need to remember is that schools were never set up as counselling centres and are already overburdened with initiatives and should not be seen the easy solution. In most cases, teachers are not trained counsellors but are rather wellintended educators trying to do their best. The emphasis should be placed on adequately resourcing and provisioning services in our communities. This is why I was very pleased this week to be notified of the creation of the Vulnerable Children's Hub for the Canterbury area. This is a one-stop shop for reporting and referring students at risk. This is a very positive step forward to support those of us who work with youth and is a proactive step towards addressing the inadequacies of current systems.

Just quickly I would like to welcome Lauren Brinsford to the school and Kikorangi class. It is great to have her on board as we wish Jasmin Findlay all the best as she heads off on

her maternity leave.

After Hours There is always a doctor or rural nurse specialist on call - please phone the Health Centre on the number below during normal business hours. After hours you will be directed to the appropriate assistance. The After Hours calls are managed by HML (Homecare Medical Ltd) who will assess your needs and advise your best course of action. The on-call clinician is able to access patient records, if required, to improve patient safety.

**Free for Under 13 years** for ACC and medical visits for enrolled patients.

**Tetanus Vaccine** Post childhood is due at ages 45 & 65years. Please call if you think you might be due for a booster.

Preventative Screening We are required by Ministry of Health to screen patients and to offer support to improve health outcomes. From time to time you will be asked if you are a smoker and if you would like to quit, as smoking has been proven to have one of the greatest impacts on our health, especially our heart health. We hope to have the carbon monoxide meter (as seen at the Hawarden Show) at the Health Centre next month and encourage all smokers to come and have a reading done – keep an eye out in the newsletter for when we have it on site.

**Spots (Acne)** Acne is a highly treatable condition and does not need to be suffered – if you have spots that you would like to be rid of please make an appointment with the GP to discuss the treatment options.

**Repeat Prescriptions by phone** please allow 48 hours for these to be processed, if the GP has indicated at a previous consultation that they have authorized for this to happen. REGULAR 3 MONTHLY checks with the Doctor are required for on-going prescriptions. Please ensure you have at least two weeks supply of medications on hand at any time.

**Flu Vaccine** This is now available and is free for; pregnant women, people with certain chronic conditions and for people 65 years and over. Please make an appointment with the nurse.

**Shingles Vaccine (Zostavax)** is available for people over the age of 50. It costs \$200 and can be ordered in on request, please phone the nurse if you are interested in more information about this.

Senior Chef we are aiming to start a Senior Chef course in May and June 2017 and would welcome expressions of interest from members of the community who are 65 years or older or over 55 with chronic health condition. THIS IS A FREE 8 WEEK course – held locally. We need a minimum of 12 people to go ahead with this, so grab a friend and give us a call!
