



Korero 10 Term 1 2017

With a recent increase surge in potential abductions around schools, it is timely to remind families on how to keep safe. The most important way parents can protect their children is to teach them to be wary of potentially dangerous situations - this will help them when dealing with strangers as well as with known adults who may not have good intentions. Help children recognise the warning signs of suspicious behaviour, such as when an adult asks them to disobey their parents or do something without permission, asks them to keep a secret, asks children for help, or makes them feel uncomfortable in any way. Also, talk to your children about how they should handle dangerous situations. One way is to teach them "No, Go, Yell, Tell." If in dangerous situations, kids should say no, run away, yell as loud as they can, and tell a trusted adult what happened right away. Make sure that your children know that it is okay to say no to an adult in a dangerous situation and to yell to keep themselves safe, even if they are indoors. Having a password for other adults to use if they are picking your child up unexpectedly from school, is also excellent advice and prevented a potential abduction this week.

It is hard to believe that we are already a quarter of the way through the school year. How the school year is flying by and students should now be fully immersed in their learning. I know many of our Year 11-13 students will be feeling the pressures as assessments culminate at the end of the term and it will be essential that they are using their time effectively to ensure they achieve to their potential. Also, our primary classes begin their goal setting meetings this week. These are a very valuable opportunity for parents to come into the classroom and connect with their children's learning and see the progress they are making. Also, parents and caregivers of Year 9-13 should now be regularly engaging with their children's fortnightly progress reports. It is an important tool to provide on-going regular feedback to families.

With the end of term one, it is important to remember that term two signifies the transition to the winter uniform. It is the expectation that all students begin term two in the winter uniform. If there are any questions about this please contact the school office. It is critical that all students are in the correct uniform for school photos which are at the beginning of week four-term two, Monday 22 May.

Due to the beginning of teacher contract negotiations, all our teaching staff will be involved in a paid union meeting on the afternoon of Friday 5 May; the first Friday back in term 2. Due to this, school buses will be running early on this day, departing Hurunui College at 12.30pm. All students will be arriving home approximately two and a half hours earlier. For non-bus students and students living in the town, parents are asked to collect their children from school at this earlier time. If this is going to cause undue inconvenience for any families, supervision can be arranged for any students who are required to stay at the school through to 3pm, when the remaining students will need to be collected directly from school. Please contact the school office if supervision is needed.

The After Hours calls are managed by HML (Homecare Medical Ltd) who will assess your needs and advise your best course of action. The on call clinician is able to access patient records, if required, to improve patient safety.

Tetanus Vaccine Post childhood is due at ages 45 & 65years. Please call if you think you might be due for a booster.

Spots (Acne) is a highly treatable condition and does not need to be suffered – if you have spots that you would like to be rid of please make an appointment with the GP to discuss the treatment options

Preventative Screening We are required by Ministry of Health to screen patients and to offer support to improve health outcomes. From time to time you will be asked if you are a smoker and if you would like to quit, as smoking has been proven to have one of the greatest impacts on our health, especially our heart health. We hope to have the carbon monoxide meter (as seen at the Hawarden Show) at the Health Centre next month and encourage all smokers to come and have a reading done – keep an eye out in the newsletter for when we have it on site.

Repeat Prescriptions by phone please allow 48 hours for these to be processed, if the GP has indicated at a previous consultation that they have authorized for this to happen. REGULAR 3 MONTHLY checks with the Doctor are required for on-going prescriptions. Please ensure you have at least two weeks supply of medications on hand at any time.

Flu Vaccine This is now available and is free for; pregnant women, people with certain chronic conditions and for people 65 years and over. Please make an appointment with the nurse.

Shingles Vaccine (Zostavax) is available for people over the age of 50. It costs \$200 and can be ordered in on request, please phone the nurse if you are interested in more information about this.
