

At our Duffy Books Role model assembly last term, we were very fortunate to have Fifi Colston come to our school to speak to our children. Fifi is a very creative New Zealander who wears 'many hats' and has a great number of talents. She is an artist; writer, illustrator, arts and crafts demonstrator, props and costume maker and wearable art designer, She usually has at least five things on the go at one time. 'I have a very low boredom threshold!' she says.

Fifi is a published novelist, her 3rd junior fiction novel 'Glory' shortlisted for the LIANZA Esther Glen Award. Her two more recent nonfiction titles on creative costuming for kids 'Wearable Wonders' and 'Ghoulish Get Ups' have both won awards with 'Wearable Wonders' earning the Elsie Locke Non Fiction Medal.

Fifi spoke to us about her love of books as a child and her passion for drawing and making things. Fifi has also worked for WETA and was on What Now regularly to teach children 'arts and crafts activities' many years ago with Simon Barnett.
