We have been fortunate to win a grant from Kiwifirst-Boeing for a Lego Mindstorms Robotics kit and extras (valued at over \$2000) to allow **2** teams to take part in the Robotics and Programming activities this year. The students involved will be in Room 3 and 4. This is extremely exciting as the skills and values they learn are so crucial to a number of jobs that are evolving in our future workplaces.
